The Dermoscopy ECHO program aims to better equip health professionals with expert-level knowledge to provide high quality medical care by providing training on use of a dermatoscope and the subsequent interpretation of the results. An ECHO is an interactive, medical rounds, web-based learning model rooted in case presentation and validated by the NEJM.

This monthly free CME/CEU activity is available virtually and aims to equip medical providers with knowledge and confidence to use a dermatoscope and make appropriate clinical decisions for patients presenting with a dermatological condition in a primary care setting.

What is it?

Arizona State University is launching a new Dermoscopy ECHO Program (web-based learning rooted in case presentation validated by NEJM) designed to connect a team of dermoscopy experts with medical providers across the country to teach beginning and advanced dermoscopic technique. The Dermoscopy ECHO program aims to equip clinical healthcare providers with the skills and knowledge in identification and decision-making for dermatological conditions. Case-based learning strategies will be woven into each Dermoscopy ECHO session to help learners develop the skills they need to both effectively use and interpret the dermatoscope findings. Ultimately, participants will be able to make decisions about follow-up referrals, leading to enhanced patient care.

When is it?

Program launch is Monday, October 10, at 12pm. Sessions will occur monthly, meeting second Monday of the month from 12PM - 1PM (Arizona-time).

Who should attend?

Clinical medical providers (MD, DO, PA, NP, etc) and nurses that have an interest in dermatology.
