

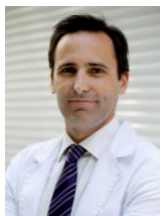
Dear IDS Members,

As you already know, dermoscopy and its use is not any more just about skin tumors and we have learned a lot recently about the use of the method in the field of [inflammoscopy](#) and general dermatology, therefore we also recommend you to read a paper speaking about dermoscopy and its potential use in the differentiation of pityriasis rubra pilaris, plaque psoriasis, lichen spinulosus and lichen nitidus.

Another interesting paper deals with dermoscopic characteristics of [acquired reactive perforating disorders](#) and the potential use of dermoscopy in this field of Dermatology. Sound interesting enough? We believe so!
